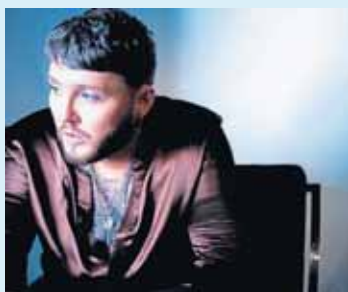

Food with One eye on Earth

Food punctuates our days – three meals, a snack here, a packet of crisps there... The need to eat is central to being human, but the need to cook? For many of us, that's felt absolutely relentless over the last year.

Anna Jones, inset, puts pandemic cooking more charmingly. She calls it the "rhythm we have been building our days around", suggesting it's been less punctuation, more necessary anchor.

"I know people have become jaded with it at a times. Even I, as a cook and a writer, have become slightly jaded with cooking for a family three times a day," she says. "But it's something that's definitely giving people life, and something they can control and be excited about."

The practicalities of lockdowns – especially the great flour rush of March 2020 – have arguably shifted perspectives a little too.

"We'd become so used to convenience and being able to just put our hands on anything we want at any time, and I think not being able to get hold of everything was a bit of a wake-up call for people," considers Jones, who says

circumstances have forced us to improvise a lot more in the kitchen. They've even made her "pare back" to the everyday essentials. "I used to have every flour, every lentil, every pulse, every spice in the house, and I've stripped back my cupboards."

Jones reckons as a result, many of us will now cook more instinctively – "with slightly more intuition than just following a recipe". Recipes are Jones' game though (via her books and newspaper column), and hers have long been designed as launchpads for home cooks, not definitive end points.

Her new cookbook *One: Pot, Pan, Planet* reflects that. It features easily tweakable noodles and pasta dishes galore (like her lime and double ginger soba noodles), as well as simple traybakes (leek and potato with romesco sauce), salads (roast carrot and grain) and grown-up desserts (chocolate, olive oil and rosemary cake), while the "10 simple ideas" section (eg for ways

with peas, broccoli, peppers) rattles off swift dinner ideas.

It's also packed with recipes inspired by other cultures and food traditions, from white miso ramen, to congee and lemongrass and tofu larb. The core of *One*, though, is "to knit two things together". First, "the cooking I'm doing now" – by which Jones means the kind of

cooking you do with a small child around, as opposed to cooking pre-parenthood. "I'm a cook

and a chef, I can chop things and cook things a bit quicker – so I'd make more complicated recipes and people would be like, 'But that would take me an hour and a half!'" Now, quick and simple notches higher on the priority list.

The second factor she was keen to weave in was sustainability and climate change. "Eating vegetables is the most impactful thing you can do for the planet. The second most impactful thing is making sure the food you buy and cook, you don't waste," says Jones.

ORECCHIETTE WITH SWEETCORN AND GREEN CHILLI

(SERVES 4)

INGREDIENTS

- A bunch of rainbow or Swiss chard (about 250g), stalks and leaves separated
- 2 green chillies, finely chopped
- The kernels from 2-3 corn on the cob or 350g frozen kernels
- 400g orecchiette or other small dried pasta
- Extra virgin olive oil
- Smoked salt or flaky sea salt
- 250g ricotta or vegan ricotta-style cheese (I like the Tofutti brand)
- The zest and juice of an unwaxed lemon
- A large bunch of basil, leaves picked

METHOD

1. Bring a large pan of well-salted water to the boil. Finely chop the stalks and shred the leaves of the chard and finely chop your chillies. If you are using frozen corn, put it into a heatproof bowl and cover with boiling water. Add the pasta to the boiling water and cook according to the packet instructions or until al dente.

2. While the pasta is cooking, heat a tablespoon of oil in a large frying pan over a medium heat, then add the corn (drained if using frozen) and a good pinch

of smoked salt or sea salt and black pepper. Cook for four to five minutes (a few minutes longer if you are using frozen) until the kernels are tender and beginning to brown.

3. Next, add the chard stalks and cook for a few minutes more, before adding the leaves and the chillies. Cook for a further four to five minutes, until the leaves have wilted.

4. Drain the pasta once it is cooked,

reserving a large mugful of the cooking water. Add the pasta to the frying pan with half the ricotta and half the reserved pasta water and mix well. Turn off the heat, then add the lemon zest and juice. Toss, then, if need be, add more cooking water, so you end up with a silky sauce that coats each piece of pasta. Toss through most of the basil. Spoon the pasta into bowls, spoon the rest of the ricotta on top and finish with the last of the basil leaves.





CASHEW NUT PAKORAS WITH GREEN DIPPING SAUCE

(MAKES 12)

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE PAKORAS:

- 100g cashew nuts
- 1 red onion, thinly sliced
- 1tsp chilli powder
- 1 handful of fresh curry leaves
- 1 green chilli, thinly sliced
- 1 thumb-sized piece of ginger, finely grated
- 3 cloves of garlic, finely grated
- 1tsp (heaped) fennel seeds
- 1tsp (heaped) cumin seeds
- Groundnut or vegetable oil for shallow frying
- ½tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 80g chickpea flour
- 2tbsp ghee, softened
- Salt and black pepper

FOR THE GREEN SAUCE:

- 1tsp black mustard seeds
- 1tsp cumin seeds
- A bunch of coriander, stalks and leaves
- ½ a bunch of mint, leaves picked, stalks discarded
- 1 thumb-sized piece of ginger, peeled and roughly chopped
- 1 clove of garlic, peeled
- 1 green chilli
- 1tsp honey or agave syrup
- Juice of 1 unwaxed lime
- 1tbsp coconut oil

TO SERVE:

- Lime-dressed salad leaves (optional)

METHOD

1. Measure the cashew nuts into a small, heatproof bowl and cover with double the volume of hot water. Set aside.
2. Next, make the green dipping sauce. Toast the mustard and cumin seeds in a dry deep frying pan until the cumin smells fragrant and the mustard seeds start to pop. Remove from the heat and tip into a blender with the rest of the green dipping sauce ingredients. Blend until smooth (adding up to two tablespoons of cold water to loosen if you need – it should be like thick yoghurt), then taste and add more salt, lime or honey to balance. Cover and set aside.
3. Mix the onion, chilli powder, curry leaves, chilli, ginger, garlic, fennel and cumin seeds in a large mixing bowl and give it a really good scrunch. Season generously with salt and black pepper and leave to one side. Drain the cashews well and add to the bowl.
4. Add 3cm-depth of oil to the frying pan and heat gently over a low-medium heat. Add the bicarbonate of soda, chickpea flour and ghee to the mixing bowl along with 60ml of cold water and mix until it comes together in a chunky batter.
5. Test to see if the oil is ready by dropping a little of the mixture into the hot oil. If it sizzles and rises to the top it is ready. Add tablespoons of the mixture to the hot oil, a few at a time so as not to overcrowd the pan. Fry for a couple of minutes each side, using a slotted spoon to turn them over. Drain the cooked pakoras on kitchen paper and continue until all the mixture has been used.
6. Season with a pinch of salt while warm and serve with the dipping sauce and some lime-dressed salad leaves if you like.

HONEY, ALMOND AND CARDAMOM DRIZZLE CAKE

(MAKES ONE LOAF)

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE CAKE:

- 200g light spelt or plain flour
- 150g ground almonds
- 2tsp baking powder
- 250g unsalted butter, softened, plus extra for greasing
- 200g demerara sugar
- 150ml honey or maple syrup
- Zest of an unwaxed orange
- Zest of an unwaxed lemon
- 4 medium organic eggs

FOR THE DRIZZLE:

- 4 cardamom pods
- 4tbsp honey or maple syrup
- 1tsp orange blossom water
- 2tsp toasted sesame seeds
- 1tsp fennel seeds
- 1tsp coriander seeds

TO SERVE:

- A good drizzle of honey or maple syrup
- Plain yoghurt of your choice

METHOD

1. Heat the oven to 170°C/150°C fan/gas 3.
2. Grease a 900g loaf tin and line with baking paper. Put the flour, almonds, baking powder and a good pinch of sea salt into a large mixing bowl and whisk until there are no lumps of baking powder. In a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, or with an electric hand whisk, beat the butter, sugar and honey until creamy and combined.
3. Add both orange and lemon zests, then the eggs one by one, mixing well between additions.
4. Add the dry ingredients a large spoonful at a time, again mixing between additions. Tip the mixture into the prepared tin and smooth out the top with the back of a spoon. Bake for 55 minutes to one hour, until the cake is dark golden on top. It will sink a little in the middle.
5. Take the cake out of the oven and leave in the tin. Bash the cardamom pods with a pestle in a mortar to release the seeds, then put the seeds into a small saucepan with all the remaining drizzle ingredients. Bring to a simmer and reduce to a thin syrup – it will thicken a little more as it cools.
6. Prick the cake a few times with a skewer and pour over the syrup, then leave the cake in the tin until cooled completely. Serve in thick slices, with yoghurt mixed with honey.



James finds Medicine for his demons



When James Arthur won The X Factor in 2012, he set out on a path of fame, public controversy and ultimately redemption.

Nearly a decade on, three of the 33-year-old's albums have charted at either number one or two.

The Middlesbrough native also maintains an energetic fan base, born out of his time on Simon Cowell's talent show and grown by an ear for a hook and, more recently, a handful of high-profile collaborations with the likes of Blink-182 drummer Travis Barker and Sigala.

But his success has also been tempered by mental health struggles and drugs.

His career almost entirely derailed in 2014 when he parted ways with Cowell's Syco label following accusations that he used a homophobic lyric in a song.

But finally Arthur is in a place where he feels he has the maturity and creative control to make something a little different.

"I do sometimes feel I have to work twice as hard as everyone else just because of where I came from," he explains over the phone from the home in Surrey he shares

with his girlfriend – complete with indoor swimming pool, recording studio and pool room.

"It has been a long time coming for me to get to a place where I have full creative control."

Lockdown inspired creativity in some artists.

For others, it has been one long episode of writer's block.

Arthur falls firmly into the former camp.

He recorded an album in three months during the first national lockdown in England and took up hiking and running.

The single *Medicine*, which dropped on Friday, is the first taste of that project.

His languid voice, almost tailor-made for the radio, combines with brash production and upfront lyrics – "When I'm suicidal/you don't let me spiral".

"I learnt a lot about myself and the things that I want to do and the things I don't want to do," he says of the past year.

"My girlfriend was really supportive in that time.

"I found I loved hiking. That was a big thing.

"The song is about love over adversity, about the things that

help you through the dark times."

In the past Arthur's mouth may have got him in trouble, but now his honesty feels more refreshing than antagonistic.

He entered 2020 struggling with his demons, stemming from his time in foster care and his parents' split, and on stage in Madrid suffered an anxiety attack.

Shortly after, he was rushed to hospital with flu-like symptoms where doctors found he had a gallbladder infection.

"I had hit a roadblock," he recalls.

"I had this arena tour in March that I had to do, but before that it was a question of, 'Do I go off to rehab in Texas to address these childhood traumas that I hadn't processed?'"

He decided to check himself into the Nightingale, a private mental health hospital in central London, where he began cognitive behavioural therapy, embarked on a course of medication and got fit.

Soon March was upon him and he went out on tour again where, by his own reckoning, he "smashed it".

Of course, the tour was curtailed by coronavirus and Arthur was grounded once again.

The first few months were tough.

"I thought I was going to be one of the statistics, having a little bit of asthma and things like that.

Latest music OUR PICK OF THIS WEEK'S

LORETTA LYNN STILL WOMAN ENOUGH

For her 50th solo studio album, Loretta Lynn is looking back as well as forward, re-examining her legacy and working with a new generation of country singers. The coal miner's daughter has recorded new versions of some of her best-known tracks, as well as her takes on American traditional music. But she kicks off with the catchy title track, singing "Well I've been through some bad times" in true country style. "Still got what it takes," Lynn insists, and more than six decades after starting out, it is impossible not to agree.

BLACK HONEY WRITTEN AND DIRECTED

Brighton four-piece Black Honey's new album *Written And Directed* is a high-energy follow-up to their self-titled debut. Lead singer Izzy B Phillips's dynamic vocals give their new release plenty of vigour and its tracks draw on a wide variety of influences. The spirited album seems perfectly suited to live gigs and the indie group will surely be hoping to showcase their punchy new material in front of crowds this summer. *Fire, I Do It To Myself* and *I Like The Way You Die* are particular highlights.

ALBUM OF THE WEEK

THUNDER ALL THE RIGHT NOISES

There is something endearing about a band who plough their own furrow without regard for what is "in". Thunder are one such band. They formed in London on the cusp of the 90s with voluminous hair and riffs straight out of the Led Zeppelin playbook. Their appearance, their sound, was unsuited to the times, which would soon be dominated by the angular, sardonic riffs of Britpop. *All The Right Noises*, their 13th album, is part grunge extravaganza, part riotous rock 'n' roll nostalgia trick. Danny Bowes and his band may be fathers now, but there is some serious hip-swinging going on here, that is before the subject turns to Trump and Brexit. Listen and be surprised.

THE FALCON AND THE WINTER SOLDIER

6 EPISODES, DISNEY+

The dust has barely settled on the intriguing final episode of WandaVision, which kick-started phase four of the Marvel Cinematic Universe, and a new mystery unfolds in a six-part fantasy adventure featuring characters who joined forces in the final moments of Avengers: Endgame. Sokovian colonel Zemo (Daniel Bruhl), who wreaked havoc in Captain America: Civil War, returns with a vengeance, endangering the human race. Sam Wilson aka Falcon (Anthony Mackie) and Bucky Barnes aka Winter Soldier (Sebastian Stan) are entrusted with thwarting Zemo's Machiavellian scheme.



COUNTRY COMFORT

10 EPISODES, NETFLIX
COMEDY/DRAMA/ROMANCE/
MUSICAL

American Idol alumnus Katharine McPhee plays an aspiring singer in a 10-part Netflix comedy created by Caryn Lucas. Bailey (McPhee) dreams of stardom in country music but Lady Luck delivers her instead to the home of handsome cowboy Beau (Eddie Cibrian) and his five children. The brothers and sisters lost their mother two years ago and have exhausted nine nannies so far. Without any experience or relevant qualifications, Bailey is press-ganged into becoming carer number 10. The youngsters respond positively to Bailey's boundless optimism and Southern charm.

THE LAST SHIFT (15)

BUY, DOWNLOAD OR STREAM
DRAMA

After 38 years of dedicated service, Stanley (Richard Jenkins) prepares to retire from the overnight shift at Oscar's Chicken & Fish drive-thru in Albion, Michigan. He has saved up money to move back home and take care of his mother, who has dementia. Before Stanley bids farewell to the job, branch manager Shazz (Da'Vine Joy Randolph), childhood friend Dale (Ed O'Neill) and a trickle of customers, the veteran must train his replacement: a young father called Jevon (Shane Paul McGhie) on probation for defacing city monuments and resisting arrest. The newcomer treats the work at Oscar's with disdain and doesn't share Stanley's devotion to warm customer service. Experience and youth collide, creating friction in the kitchen, which reminds Stanley of one of his mother's sayings: "Some people turn up their sleeves and some people don't turn up at all." The Last Shift is a heartfelt drama, which sets up the two central characters as culturally divided opponents destined to learn valuable life lessons in each other's company.



Documentary filmmaker Andrew Cohn, making his narrative feature debut, doesn't stray too far from a well-trodden path of self-realisation, flecking gently paced scenes with earthy humour, which invite us to laugh at Stanley and his idiosyncrasies almost as much as we should laugh with him. Jenkins imbues his graveyard shift stalwart with genuine warmth, gelling pleasingly with McGhie's rebel, who mocks Stanley's uncanny talent for predicting the dipping sauce a customer will want with their order.

"I realised the best therapy for me was in making music, so that is what I did."

You don't need to point out the stigma that comes with starting your career on The X Factor, Arthur is willing to bring it up himself.

"Ballads are a thing I have stayed away from on this album," he says half laughing.

This album is different, he tells me. "Even halfway through the process of writing it I realised that this is really a moment in time."

Medicine by James Arthur is out now.

DRAKE

SCARY HOURS 2

In January, Certified Lover Boy, Drake's sixth album proper, was delayed until late 2021 just a few weeks before its expected release date. To fill this Drake-shaped hole in your life, the Canadian rapper has released a three-song EP that sees him in polished autopilot mode. As an amuse-bouche to keep fans happy, Scary Hours 2 works. Ostensibly a sequel to his 2018 EP of the same name, it feels like a purposely low-stakes affair. These songs offer a promising if insubstantial glimpse at what Certified Lover Boy could sound like.

MIDDLE KIDS

TODAY WE'RE THE GREATEST

In their native Australia, Middle Kids are already a band of some repute, with a top 10 album under their belt. Outside, however, they are yet to make their breakthrough, despite slots supporting Bloc Party, The War On Drugs and Cold War Kids and some primetime US TV appearances. Today We're The Greatest, their second album, could be that moment. There are flashes of melodic brilliance on the brass-featuring single Questions but more often than not, Middle Kids are still sticking too close to their influences.

THE SENATOR (12)

On July 18 1969, Senator Teddy Kennedy (Jason Clarke) travels to Chappaquiddick Island with his entourage. He takes part in a sailboat race, before unwinding at a party. Teddy leaves in a drunken state behind the wheel of a car with Mary Jo Kopechne (Kate Mara), who worked on brother Bobby's presidential campaign. Their speeding vehicle crashes off a bridge and Mary Jo drowns. Teddy takes the one-word advice of his father – "alibi" – setting in motion a chain of events that could forever tarnish the legacy of a political dynasty. The Senator is a timely drama about the grubbiness of US politics.



WONDER WOMAN

Diana Prince (Gal Gadot) now works as an archaeology expert at the Smithsonian Institution. She has found her calling as mankind's secret protector, although she is still haunted by the loss of American pilot Steve Trevor (Chris Pine) at the end of the First World War. Elsewhere in Washington DC, Maxwell Lord (Pedro Pascal), CEO of Black Gold Co-operative – "The oil company run by the people for the people" – discovers a way to grant wishes. His Machiavellian scheme pits Diana against her bookish friend, gemologist Barbara Ann Minerva (Kristen Wiig).





PIXELJUNK RAIDERS GOOGLE STADIA, ACTION, £19.99

We want to like this Stadia exclusive purely on the basis of its futuristic retro mishmash of visuals, bursting with colour, odd music and the general space that is created. But unfortunately the essential component – gameplay – crash lands. It seems like the perfect set-up: You're tasked with saving survivors from a planet that's been invaded by aliens, with battle and scavenging in between. But for all that, actually fighting foes was a slog, leaving our avatar unable to move as fast as we would like and stripping us of weapons after each loss, making it really difficult to progress. We like a challenge but this just felt a bit over the top, making us want to give up. The choice of upgrades and different moves is great but is not enough to turn this raider around.



GHOSTS 'N GOBLINS RESURRECTION NINTENDO SWITCH, RUN AND GUN, £24.99

It's hard not to like this retelling of an arcade classic, despite it being insanely tricky. Making your way through zombies and other fatal beasts is near impossible at times, yet for those who dare to persevere, it is entertaining. Oh, and the stiff controls make it even harder. Some will get frustrated. We just had to laugh at how tricky it was – it was laugh or cry – and for that reason, it's not something we could play for too long. Aside from this, we loved the art and silliness of the game, which means your character Arthur loses his clothes with each fatal hit. But once you survive a level, boy is it satisfying.

Serene and dream-like, Maquette is a puzzle game set in a world built around the memories of a boy-meet-girl romance. The gameplay centres around a diorama of the expressionist world the game is set in, where players must move ornate items and furniture in the diorama in order to complete puzzles and open up new areas of the world. All the while, the memories of a relationship are played out through audio snippets and floating text that appear as you move through the game, serving as waypoints through the different puzzles as they expand outwards and grow the world around you.

3 OUT OF 10

You have to applaud the developers of 3 Out Of 10 for trying something a bit different. Billed as a "playable sitcom", this cartoon title bridges the gap

between TV series and gaming more seamlessly than previous examples we've tried. You could call it passive gaming, so it may not appeal to those who want deep involvement, as this is very much an easy-going ride, with mini games scattered between the story, and the ability to roam freely around. And for what it's

worth, the story is good – if a little silly but did make us laugh – told across five episodes at present, with plans to launch a second season soon. The artwork is pleasing on the eye, the characters are fun, engaging, and with the ability to skip tasks, it is a well-executed pressure-off approach to gaming.

Show had star Kaley Cuoco 'aired sick'

There were days where Kaley Cuoco would cry herself to sleep while making *The Flight Attendant*.

The California native, best known for playing Penny in hit sitcom *The Big Bang Theory*, is an executive producer on the thriller series, and also plays the lead role, Cassie.

She optioned the book on which the show is based – by New York Times bestselling author Chris Bohjalian – a few years back, because she loved how dark it is.

But, she says, "I also wanted to bring my quirky comedic side to it, and possibly create a tone that was unique".

And it was a scary process, hence the tears, because she knew viewers would judge her choice of project, especially coming off a successful show like *The Big Bang Theory*.

"I was taking a risk, because I don't believe in my heart that someone would have hired me to play this role," elaborates the 35-year-old, who started acting as a child, and had her breakthrough role aged 16 with ABC sitcom *8 Simple Rules*.

"I could have auditioned, and I might have even given the audition of my life; I don't think someone would have given me this role. So I wanted to prove that I can

actually do more and that I love it. And it was a risk that I'm glad I took.

"But, yeah, I was pretty sick to my stomach the night before the show aired just because it was my baby. I started this thing so long ago, and you want everyone to like your baby."

Cuoco, who is married to equestrian Karl Cook, has this effervescence that means she often does not finish her sentences; suddenly, she is already on to her next witty, candid thought.

It is this energy and sense of humour that she brings to *The Flight Attendant* – an eight-part series about how an entire life can change in one night.

Cassie, a flight attendant, is on a work trip when she finds herself waking up after a big night out in the wrong hotel, in the wrong bed – and she realises the man lying next to her is dead. She has no idea what has happened but is determined to find out.

The darkly comic show proved to be a hit in the US, where it debuted last November.

It was quickly renewed for a second season, and also received nominations at this year's Golden Globe Awards, including

Best Performance by an Actress in a Television Series, Musical or Comedy for Cuoco.

This resulted in the star posting some brilliant pictures on Instagram, showing her attending the awards ceremony, which took place at the end of February, virtually from home.

"My Golden Globes was getting drunk and eating cake and pizza with my family in Oscar de la Renta," she quips. "It was awesome. I couldn't have asked for more."

What was it exactly that drew Cuoco to the role of Cassie?

"What I love the most about her is she is very reactive. The world is spinning around Cassie. And, as an actor, I am incredibly reactive. I'm not a prepared sort of a person, so it was great for me because I was just myself."

"I was reacting to what amazing Zosia (Mamet, who plays Cassie's best friend Annie) was doing, and this murder, and, 'Oh my god, the police are after me and the FBI'. These were all reactive moments, until at the end where she's like, 'I need to take control'. It's an actor's dream."

"Also, I feel like I had multiple personalities," she continues. "I mean, I got to play every emotion."

"At one point, we had been doing all these emotional scenes for three weeks. I'm like, 'Are people gonna be sick of me looking like that?' It was just constant torment on my face."

It makes sense when you realise some of the themes *The Flight Attendant* explores – trauma, dependency on alcohol, and facing demons from childhood.

"I wanted to make sure that the alcohol was not the funny part," notes Cuoco.

"Yes, she was a fun person to party with, but you see pretty early on that there is something else – it's all bubbling and it's all beneath and it's about to explode."

She elaborates: "She's a functioning alcoholic. This is not someone who's slurring in the streets all day long."

"This is someone who literally gets by because she is drinking sips of alcohol all day long. She has a career, she has great friends. But deep down, she is struggling inside."

It is certainly a different type of comedy from *The Big Bang Theory*, which focused on a group of scientists and their love interests and came to a close in 2019 after 12 seasons.

Cuoco is reflective as she addresses how, particularly when shows have aired for such a long time, there is an idea that its cast might get pigeonholed.

"I used to laugh because I was like, 'If I'm typecast as the girl next door in a sitcom for the rest of my life, I feel like that's the best thing that could ever happen to me'. I never fought that feeling."

She follows this by sharing what has been happening since *The Flight Attendant* aired across the pond.

"I've been called the newcomer recently, which is hysterical. And I'm like, 'Does anyone remember I was on that sitcom for 12 years, like six seconds ago?' Nope."

"All of a sudden, they're like, 'Look at this newcomer on the scene'. And I'm like, 'I've been here for 30 years!'"

5 MINUTES WITH... NEIL DUDGEON

Midsomer Murders has become a British television institution. Encapsulating the small-scale rivalries of middle England, the long-running drama often sees harmless disputes escalate into deadly encounters. Now, following a prolonged pause in production due to Covid, the British drama is set to return to ITV on Sunday nights with four brand new episodes. Starring United and Life Of Riley actor Neil Dudgeon as veteran police officer DCI John Barnaby, alongside The Crown and Marcella's Nick Hendrix as DS Jamie Winter, together the pair tackle all manner of crimes across the fictional county of Midsomer. With 2021 marking 10 years in the role for Dudgeon, 60, the actor tells us more about upcoming episodes.

What did you think of returning to set?

We started filming again at the beginning of October. On the first day, when I first arrived back and we started shooting The Wolf Hunter Of Little Worthy, it was all on a glamping site. It was all very Midsomer – except that everybody was distant and wearing the masks. I thought, 'This is really weird and really strange and a little bit unnerving'.

Did social distancing pose any problems?

Midsomer is a very physically affectionate set, if I can put it that way. There's lots of handshaking, hugging and kissing in the mornings, that sort of thing, and that's had to stop.

What can we expect from these episodes?

We shot two episodes before Christmas, which will be broadcast shortly, The Wolf Hunter of Little



Worthy and The Stitches Society. And then we reconvened in January and shot another. There's The Stitcher Society – it's an episode about a village where lots of people have heart problems and they're all a certain age or a similar age to me. Also, in that is Nimmy March – some older viewers may remember a series years ago Common As Muck from the mid '90s.

Will we see any other familiar faces?

In that episode, there was a young man who appeared on set who I had just seen in an entire series. Jacob Fortune-Lloyd is his name, who is in The Queen's Gambit, which is fantastic. And then there he was on our set being fantastic... In The Sting Of Death is Griff Rhys Jones, who was fascinating and hilarious. And then also I must mention Derek Griffiths, who was a hero of my childhood from Playschool and Play Away.

Were you in a spontaneous yoga class?

We had a day when we were filming scenes in the church. And we had an actual yoga teacher and her yoga class. I saw that the yoga teacher had started to put the class through their paces or warm-up and I thought, 'Ooh, I'll have some of that!'. And so I went and joined in at the back and we were doing all the warrior two [poses] and all those sort of things, right there in the graveyard with all the other ladies.

It's 10 years of playing DCI John Barnaby?

They said come and do a few episodes and I thought, 'I'll give it a try. I hope I don't destroy the show inside one episode as that would be very embarrassing, after John Nettles has done it so marvellously for 13 years and I bury it inside one episode'.

What lengths would you go to in order to convince a stranger that your house is your own?

Proof that a simple idea can often be the most effective, brand new BBC One show This Is MY House poses that very question.

Pitting one homeowner against three actors, all four contestants must set out to convince a celebrity panel that the house they are standing in is in fact theirs.

Hosted by presenter and former Strictly Come Dancing champion Stacey Dooley, This Is MY House can only be described as Would I Lie To You but with a property-themed twist.

"It's really daft and fun, it's total escapism," says 34-year-old Dooley.

"My favourite part is when you meet the partner, and they stay mute, but you have three strangers declaring their undying love for this person.

"It's so awkward, the real homeowner has to watch these strangers tell their husband or wife how gorgeous they are."

It is a change of pace for Dooley, who is far more likely to be found tackling hard-hitting documentary

projects than hosting a primetime entertainment show.

"We've all had such a hellish time and everyone has had such an unbearable year, and this show is just such a laugh.

"We're all wired with these prejudices and unconscious biases, and find ourselves automatically judging people, so I love the fact the show breaks down those boundaries and it goes against the grain.

"Right at the start when I signed up, I said I didn't want to know who the homeowner was or who the actors were, so I could play along as we filmed.

"At the end of filming when the actors broke character, it was so interesting hearing about their real selves.

"So I love how the show goes against everything you know."

Featuring a celebrity panel composed of comedians Bill Bailey, Emily Attack, Jamali Maddix and Judi Love, This Is MY House is a show packed full of laughs and awkward moments in equal measure.

As the panellists are drip fed clues and questioned by Dooley throughout the episode, the four

celebrities sit back and confer as to who the real homeowner is.

"Emily is a total sweetheart, I have never worked with her before so that was lovely," says Dooley.

"Judi is a scream, she is so funny; Bill is the kindest man in television, he bought me a cake on the last day of filming, and Jamali reminds me of the lads I grew up with which was really lovely.

"Jamali had the best eye for honesty though, nothing got past him, he is so sharp."

Testing the comedians' judgment to the limit, the series is at its funniest when the celebrities are convinced of the imposter, only to get it terribly wrong.

"It was interesting because I think we all thought we'd be really good judges of character and figure it out straightaway, but it was so much harder than we thought," says Attack, 31.

"The more we filmed, the more we thought we could figure it out and learn from the last.

"It was quite funny when there were pets involved because we just assumed they would run straight to the owner, but they often didn't. The dog was just generally confused as to why a load of strangers were in its owner's bedroom.

"Jamali should actually be a

detective, he got really stuck in with finding out the real homeowners, his commitment was really impressive."

"Essentially I'm a lie detector," chimes in fellow panellist Maddix, 29.

And with a cash prize up for grabs, there is more than just pride at stake.

If the homeowner convinces the panel the house is theirs, they walk away with a £1,000 prize. If the celebrities guess an actor, the homeowner walks away with nothing.

However, despite the celebrities' initial expectations when it came to the ease of the guessing game, the realities of sifting fact from fiction proved to be a more difficult challenge.

"It's a lot harder than you think to identify the real owners and we were caught out a few times," remarks the show's second Strictly Come Dancing champion, Bailey, 56.

"I think everyone displayed good intuition, especially Jamali who seemed to have a good instinct for investigating.

"It was surprising how much of all of our own life experiences were brought to bear for this show.

"Video calls have shown us all

how curious we are about the lives of others and how the backgrounds of video calls have generated as much interest as the calls themselves.

"It also gives us a glimpse into other people's lives."

It is a view seconded by fellow comedian Love, 40.

"I am a little bit nosy to be honest," she declares.

"I think when you look at society, and how our perceptions are formed by the way people dress, where they live, and looking at their different relationships, it's really interesting and that drew me into the show.

"I thought I'd easily be able to spot the liars, it's a real life game of Guess Who? and who doesn't like that?

"Jamali was great, he had a real way of taking the information and processing it without saying much and then he'd come to a conclusion.

"Most of the time he was right."

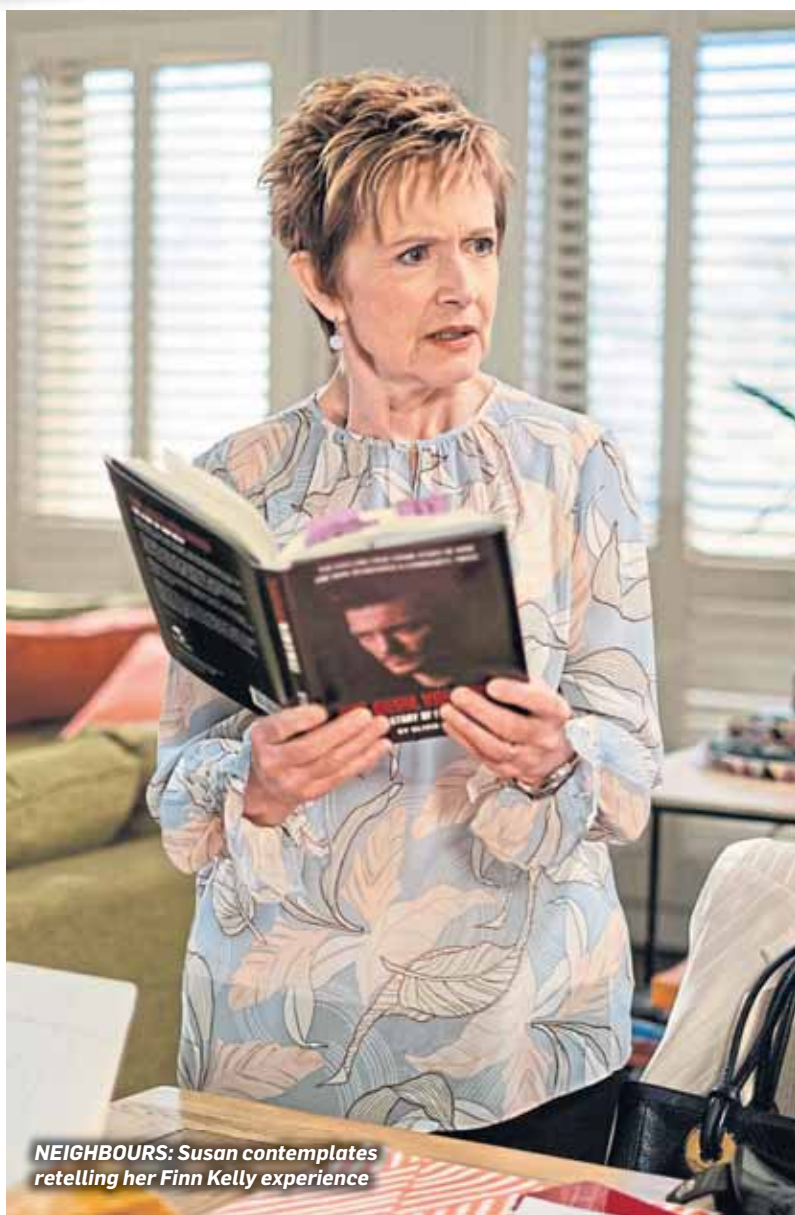

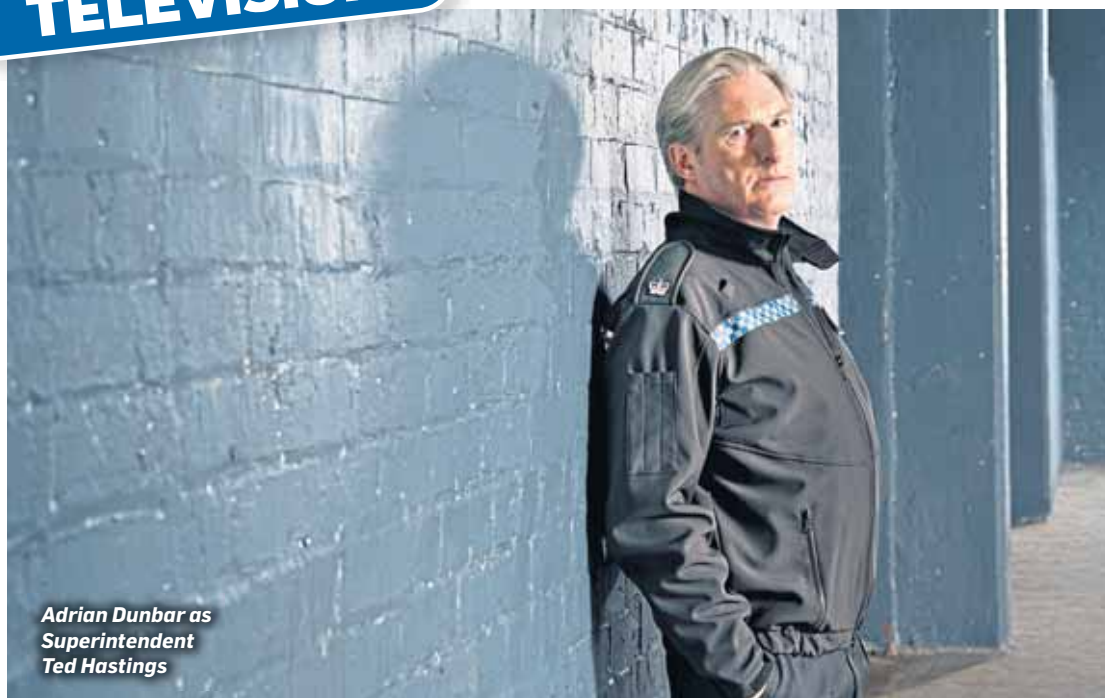

Big shocks are all in the Line Of Duty

Few shows whip their fans into a frenzy like *Line Of Duty* does. The anticipation surrounding series six of the BBC police drama is immense – heightened, perhaps, because of a delayed air date (filming had to be halted due to the Covid pandemic).

You see, Ted Hastings' famous catchphrases – "Mother of God!" – Jed Mercurio's clever, twist-heavy writing, and the impressively high-calibre of guest stars are just a few elements that make *Line Of Duty* stand out in the world of TV dramas.

And you won't be disappointed by the seven new episodes, which are set 18 months on from series five, and see the return of stars Vicky McClure (DI Kate Fleming), Adrian Dunbar (Supt Ted Hastings) and Martin Compston (DS Steve Arnott), alongside new faces Shalom Brune-Franklin and Kelly Macdonald.

Here, we chat with those stellar cast members to find out more.

TENSE TEASERS

Scot Macdonald is this series' guest lead; she plays Detective Chief Inspector Joanne Davidson, a senior investigating officer on an unsolved murder case.

Her suspicious conduct attracts the attention of Anti-Corruption and, as AC-12 uncover deeper and darker information,

DCI Davidson could turn out to be their most dangerous adversary yet...

Meanwhile, we know there's a fourth and final "H" yet to be identified within the Central Police (that's the codename for a network of corrupt police which has been discovered in the previous series, remember?).

The cast members are all very careful not to give away any spoilers, but Nottingham native McClure, 37, says: "I think what we can safely say is that we're all facing consequences from series five."

"Kate's always had a slightly tricky

personal life, very dedicated to the job – and remains so."

Scottish star Compston, who hails from Greenock, gives a little more away about the drama to come.

"The relationship between all the characters is probably a bit strained after everything they've been through – and Steve is struggling personally with his back," reveals the 36-year-old, who we saw lead another BBC drama, *The Nest*, last year.

"He's getting more and more problems with painkillers. There's some darker stuff for him because he's kind of got this image in his head that he's sort of like 'Super Cop' and he doesn't want to give that image away, so he's kind of coming to a breaking point. There are some brilliant scenes as an actor in there so I was really excited reading it, and hopefully did the material justice."

FEELING THE PRESSURE

Discussing what we can expect from her role in the show, *Trainspotting* and *Boardwalk Empire* star Macdonald suggests her character is "tortured" and "lonely".

"I was extremely nervous to become involved in the project," she says.

"The guest lead status does feel pretty momentous. It was a bit like being the new James Bond! So, it's very flattering, and also exciting and nerve-racking."

Twenty-six-year-old Brune-Franklin, who's appeared in *Our Girl*, plays "diligent" DC Chloe Bishop, and was also incredibly scared arriving at the readthrough with

the cast.

"I remember having a mental breakdown in the toilets before, going to my friend on the phone: 'I don't think I can do this, they're all in there!'"

The rising star – who was born in the UK, but moved to Australia as a teen – confides the difficult dialogue was the most challenging part of the role, recalling how the police interview scenes were sometimes half-hour-long takes. But there's a huge amount of support on set, she enthuses.

"Martin was always going, 'You're going to be fine. If you mess up, we'll just go back and go again'. But I was like, 'I can't be the person to mess up, I'm brand new.'"

EXTRA CHALLENGES

Brune-Franklin also admits that filming during Covid meant the shoot was a more "lonely experience" than it would have been normally because the cast weren't able to socialise together as much.

Asked how she has found life in lockdown, *This Is England* star McClure says it "has been what it's been for everybody – scary and difficult. You've just got to be careful of how much news you watch".

Compston, meanwhile, reflects on what was "heartbreaking" about returning to film *Line Of Duty* in Belfast, after the first lockdown last spring.

"There's a wee lovely restaurant below the place we used to stay and you can see a lovely couple who ran the place was packing up, shutting down," he says.

"And it's the same back home in

HIGHLIGHTING MENTAL HEALTH

Two powerful programmes highlighted the subject of mental health this week, each shining a light on a different aspect.

On Tuesday, *Our Silent Emergency* (BBC2) saw radio presenter Roman Kemp look into why suicides in young men are on the rise. For him it was a very personal journey, having lost one of his closest friends to suicide last year.

Channel 4's Caroline Flack: *Her Life And Death* went beyond the tabloid headlines to examine some of the circumstances and pressures that led the *Love Island* presenter to commit suicide in February last year.

Both programmes were uncomfortable to watch at times, but hopefully will have helped at least one poor soul.

CHILDREN IN NEED AGAIN

Comic Relief happened last night and, alas, it took place too late for me to review.

But if the standard of previous Comic Relief nights are anything to go by, it's probably for the best.

Maybe I'm seeing it through red nose-tinted spectacles, but weren't the Comic Reliefs back in the '80s and early '90s much edgier and less family-friendly?

These days it feels like a rebranded Children In Need.



Murky subject

The sex abuse case involving film director Woody Allen and his adopted daughter Dylan has all the makings of a fascinating investigative documentary series.

Unfortunately, *Allen v Farrow* (Sky Atlantic) has no such aspirations and was frustratingly one-sided.

Sex abuse is such a sensitive subject these days that I have to stress that my criticism of this four-part series is in no way me concluding that Dylan Farrow's claims against her father are without merit.

My point is that after watching this series I can't honestly say I know one way or another, simply because I don't think the

documentary's directors – Amy Ziering and Kirby Dick – had any intention of making a documentary that would seriously examine the murky case.

Some of what we see is damning. Video footage of seven-year-old Dylan describing what he allegedly did to her is certainly disturbing into watch.

But why did Ziering and Dick spend an inordinate amount of time examining the film output of Woody in order to draw spurious connections with the case, when they could really dig into thornier aspects of the story, including suspicions that Dylan had been coached into making the video by mum Mia Farrow?

That shocking allegation was certainly something the Child Sexual Abuse Clinic of the Yale/New Haven Hospital said it couldn't discount when they examined the case and declared Woody Allen innocent.

It's also frustrating that the documentary has no interest in interviewing anyone who might be in a position to disprove the claims – like Dylan's nanny, who has sworn under oath that Mia tried to force her into supporting the allegations.

Including the opposite viewpoint wouldn't discredit what Dylan is claiming, it would just give a more accurate picture of a case that isn't nearly as cut and dried as this documentary wants you to think.

LACK OF A-LISTERS

Poor Piers Morgan. After packing in his morning TV job, the only thing he has left on TV is his chat show *Life Stories* (ITV).

It has a primetime slot but I get the feeling his reputation might be hampering the show's ability to get similarly primetime stars to take part.

When the show started back in 2009 it seemed to have no problem booking legitimately famous guests like Richard Branson, Simon Cowell, Bruce Forsyth and Elton John.

His latest series, though, hasn't exactly been awash with A-list stars – Gemma Collins, Chris Eubank, Trisha Goddard and, this week, Coleen Nolan.

THE PAINTER AND THE THIEF

When the Oscar nominations were announced on Monday, there was one film absent from the list that I had considered a shoo-in for the best documentary prize.

The Painter And The Thief works best if you know as little as possible about it, but what I can say is that it starts with the theft of two paintings from an art gallery in Oslo and goes on to document

the unusually close friendship that develops between the artist Barbara Kysilkova and the thief Karl-Bertil Nordland.

Filed over the course of several years, the lives of both subjects change drastically and the documentary ends up being an incredibly moving look at friendship, forgiveness and rehabilitation.

This may sound a bit dry or depressing – however, it's anything but and I urge you to seek it out.
